#### I. Introduction

The Institute of Chartered Financial Analysts of India University, Meghalaya was established under the provisions of the Institute of Chartered Financial Analysts of India University Act, 2005 (Meghalaya Act No. 12 of 2005) vide Notification No. EDN. 261/2004/124 dated 22.02.2006 of the Government of Meghalaya. The University is sponsored by the ICFAI Society, a not-for-profit Educational Society established in 1984 under the Andhra Pradesh (Telangana Area) Public Societies Registration Act, 1350F.

In March 2021, the Institute of Chartered Financial Analysts of India University Act, 2005 was amended by the State Legislature vide Meghalaya Act No. 6 of 2021. Henceforth, the name of the University will be substituted as The ICFAI University, Meghalaya.

▶ The ICFAI University Meghalaya is located at Tura, West Garo Hills District, Meghalaya. The University believes in creating and disseminating knowledge and skills in core and frontier areas through innovative educational programmes, research, consulting and publishing and developing a cadre of professionals with a high level of competence and deep sense of ethics and commitment to the code of professional conduct.

- ▶ Finances: As per the provisions of the Act, the University is a self-financed University supported by the Sponsor Society.

- The State Legislature in its last Budget Session in March 2021 had amended the Act of the University and henceforth it shall be known as the ICFAI University Meghalaya for all intents and purposes.



#### 9. Infrastructure

The University is endowed with excellent facilities required for creating a congenial academic atmosphere. State-of-the-art infrastructure is available at the ICFAI University, Meghalaya to meet the requirements of the programs conducted.

A. Academic Complex:

The University Campus at Tura spreads across 13.5 acres of land. The Academic and Administrative building stands on a built up area of 40,156 sq.ft. It has a state-of theart infrastructure with all amenities required for quality education.

The Shillong Campus is housed in a rented building at Dhankheti, in the hub of the city. It has similar amenities as the Campus at Tura. Shillong being the educational hub for North East, the University is on the lookout for a suitable site in and around Shillong.

Both the Campuses have well-stocked libraries augmented with periodicals and journals comprising of ICFAI Publications and others. The Campuses are also well-equipped with Computer labs.

#### C. Lab Facilities:

#### **Selection and Admission Process**

Selection of applicants into respective programs is made through screening of applications and personal interviews.

#### **Postgraduate Programs**

MBA Program: The Master of Business Administration (MBA) program provides the students with the knowledge, skills and strategic perspectives essential to business leadership and managerial career. The curriculum is designed to provide a portfolio of strong functional skills and the ability to adapt and integrate these skills in different management settings. Students who have graduated in any discipline from a recognized University with an aggregate of 45% marks and above are eligible to apply for the program.

MTTM Program: This program was earlier known as the Master of Tourism Administration (MTA). However, in compliance with UGC directive, the program is renamed as Master of Travel and Tourism Management (MTTM). The MTTM program prepares students for managerial positions as required by the tourism industry, which is one of the fastest growing industries in the world. The program equips the students with entrepreneurship skills in the field of tourism administration. Students who have graduated in any discipline from a recognized University with an aggregate of 45% marks and above are eligible to apply for the Program.

M.Com Program: The Master of Commerce (M.Com) program covering areas on accounting, management, banking and economics related courses. The uniqueness of this program is that it allies with other Management courses making the student with this M.Com degree a multi-tasker. Students who have graduated in Commerce, Economics (Hons.) and Business Management from a



recognized University with an aggregate of 45% marks and above are eligible to apply for the Program.

MCA Program: The Master of Computer Application (MCA) program is based on contemporary curriculum and cutting edge pedagogy thereby equipping the students with up-to-date technical and IT skills required in public and private sectors. Students who have graduated in any discipline from a recognized University with an aggregate of 45% marks and above with Mathematics at the 10+2 level are eligible to apply for the Program.

M.A. (Education): The Master of Arts in Education (M.A. Education) program is designed to prepare the students to understand, learn and practically apply the basic tenets of Education as a discipline of study. The program will help deliver skills and strategies for learning, from the sociological to the philosophical and psychological pillars of education. This program is prepared in a way to understand how we learn, what we learn, and how we transform that learning into action. The range of issues in education is vast. Hence, it will provide opportunities to explore topics with an in depth analysis. MA (Education) will give access to a wide range of learning experiences to hone the abilities and enable one to engage positively in any context. The eligibility to seek admission into this program is a graudation in BA in Education (Honours) with an aggregate of 45%.

M.A. (English): The Master of Arts in English (M.A. English) program is designed to prepare the students to understand and appreciate the English language and literature thoroughly and at the same time effectively use the language to enhance their Speaking, Listening, Reading and Writing skills. The program seeks to offer the students a plethora of diverse topics covering almost each and every aspect of English language and literature. This will give a unique opportunity to the students to have a theoretical, philosophical and analytical view of English language and literature. The eligibility to seek admission into this program is a graudation in BA in English (Honours) with an aggregate of 50% and above.

M.A. (Political Science): The Master of Arts in Political Science (M.A. Political Science) aims at promoting knowledge to the students based on basic theories, theoretical and conceptual framework of the discipline of Political Science. In consultation with the wide existing syllabi of different Universities, certain traditional and contemporary courses have been incorporated with detailed reading and Supplementary Reading lists to acquaint the students with such available source materials for necessary consultation from time to time, and further reading to prepare themselves not only for Post Graduate

examinations but also for other competitive examinations in the near future. The eligibility to seek admission into this program is a graudation in BA in Political Science (Honours) with an aggregate of 45% and above.

M.A. (Garo): The Master of Arts in Garo (M.A. Garo) program was started in order to meet the growing demands of the students of Meghalaya, Assam and other parts of the North- East India for persuing their post graduate studies and research. Keeping this in mind, the syllabus has been prepared based on the latest publications written by local and non- local writers on the various aspects of Garo Literature and Language. The syllabus has also been framed to maintain the standard at par with the syllabi of other communities in other universities of North East India. Importance has also been given to the studies of other Indian and English Literatures that are relevant to the courses. The eligibility to seek admission into this program is a graudation in B.A. in Garo (Honours) with an aggregate of 45% or B.A. (Pass) with Garo as a Pass Course, with not less than 50% in aggregate in the said paper.

#### **Undergraduate Programs**

**BBA:** The Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) program imparts an in-depth knowledge and broad understanding of functional areas of Management. The program focuses on various areas of management and prepares the students for a professional career in management and readies them for pursuing an MBA degree after graduation.

**BTTM:** The Bachelor of Travel and Tourism Management (BTTM) program prepares the students for managerial positions required by the tourism industry. The program envisages the students as entrepreneurs who want to start their business in the field of tourism and /or hospitality sectors.

**B.Com**: Commerce is the corner stone of the individual, the national and the global life, without which no economic activity can take place. The Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com) Program of the University opens a wide range of area for the students who want to make a mark for themselves in the public and private sectors. The program will help them to gain sufficient knowledge and skills in the field of economics and management which are the core essentials of the commercial world.

**B.A.** (Hons) Economics: The Bachelor of Arts (Hons.) in Economics aims to meet the requirements of the dynamic world and equip students with the requisite knowledge giving them an edge in the current scenario and open up avenues to pursue varied career options. With this in mind, the core courses of Economics are supplemented by

Management related courses.

**B.A.** (Hons) Education: The Bachelor of Arts (Hons.) in Education program is designed to prepare the students to understand, learn and practically apply the basic tenets of Education as a discipline of study. The program will help deliver skills and strategies for learning, from the sociological to the philosophical and psychological pillars of education. This program is prepared in a way to understand how we learn, what we learn, and how we transform that learning into action. The range of issues in education is vast. Hence, it will provide opportunities to explore topics with an in depth analysis. B.A. Education (Hons) will give access to a wide range of learning experiences to hone the abilities and enable one to engage positively in any context.

**B.A.** (Hons) English: The Bachelor of Arts (Hons.) in English program is designed to prepare the students to understand and appreciate the English language and literature thoroughly and at the same time effectively use the language to enhance their Speaking, Listening, Reading and Writing skills. The program seeks to offer the students a plethora of diverse topics covering almost each and every aspect of English language and literature. This will give a unique opportunity to the students to have a

theoretical, philosophical and analytical view of English language and literature.

**B.A.** (Hons) Political Science: The Bachelor of Arts (Hons.) in Political Science attempts to study and understand world events, their background, and the hows and whys of decisions being made that affect the people in totality. The program is designed to explain and understand the political system and politics from local to global levels. Importantly, graduates of Political Science honours are prepared for careers in government sectors, in international organizations such as the UNO, business, law, journalism, psychology to name a few.

**BCA:** Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) program provides a sound academic base in computer skills and applications from which an advanced career in computer applications can be developed. The students get a good conceptual grounding in computer usage and its practical business applications.

Eligibility for Under Graduate Programs: Students who have passed 10+2 in any stream from a recognized Board with an aggregate of 40% marks and above are eligible to apply for the Program.
